Dear Congregational School Educator:

The **Charles Crane Family Foundation** has been an important partner and benefactor for many years, providing support and encouragement to educators in Baltimore area Jewish schools. One of the benefits provided by the foundation is a stipend for full-time teachers.

If you teach at least 6 hours per week in a local religious school, you qualify for the Crane Full Time Teacher benefit. To receive the stipend, complete and submit your application online. More information, as well as the [application form](#) can be found on our website www.cjebaltimore.org/grants.

All applications must be received by May 12, 2023 to ensure distribution of funds in a timely fashion. Once we have received all applications, we will send your principal or school director a spreadsheet and ask them to verify that you are an eligible employee. Upon receiving those verifications, we will send a check to your school in July and they will distribute the payments to all of the approved applicants. Please understand that we manage close to 800 requests, which is why this process takes the remainder of the spring and early summer to complete.

According to IRS regulations, this stipend is considered taxable income, whether your school chooses to issue a separate check or to include the stipend in a payroll payment. The trustees recognize that this will result in a net stipend that is somewhat lower than the amount issued, but this ensures that the foundation and the program are tax compliant.

On behalf of the Crane Foundation trustees and the leadership of JES, thank you for your dedication to Jewish education and to being an important part of ensuring the future of our people.
